1) Take a minute to think about discrimination... Have you ever witnessed discrimination?

2) In your class work book write a short paragraph (4 to 5 sentences) of a time when you've witnessed discrimination.

Please note: There isn't a wrong/right answer to this question. If you understand what the word 'DISCRIMINATION' means then you would've been able to answer about a time when you've witnessed somebody being discriminated against.

A possible answer could be something like:

I once witnessed discrimination towards an adult male in a wheelchair. The adult male in the wheelchair was looking for a job at a restaurant. The restaurant owner didn't want to accept the person's CV. The restaurant owner just said: "Sorry, sir, we cannot have you work at our restaurant because you're in a wheelchair".

This is an example of discrimination against people with disabilities. Someone in a wheelchair might find it difficult to serve food to people but they can work perfectly well on the restaurants administration side where they can answer the phone and take bookings, etc.

3) Now you're ready to do Activity 2: Poetry reading on page 56 of your text book. You have to read the poem while standing in front of a mirror. Imagine that the mirror is your audience
