Summary of the text:

'n Vuurtoringliggie in die donker nag (A lighthouse light in the dark night)

It is the life story of Nkosi Johnson, a boy who seized the imagination of the world because he bravely fought against AIDS in his short life. At birth he was already infected with the HI-virus. Doctors said he would only live for a year. His mother named him Xolani. At an old age home in Johannesburg, a lady Gail Johnson, met Nkosi and she grew to love him. Gail later adopted him and changed his name to Nkosi Johnson. The courageous boy continued fighting against the disease and he was later able to attend school. Unfortunately parents of the school were afraid that he might infect their children with the HI-virus. Through it all Nkosi stayed positive. He was only eight years old, yet he was able to speak about his disease like an adult. He wanted to tell the whole world about orphans who fought against AIDS. Many donations were received because of how Nkosi acted and a place of care, Nkosi's Haven, was opened for AIDS sufferers. Nkosi knew he would never reach adulthood. Although he had to spend many days in hospital, he continued to explain to people not to be afraid of AIDS sufferers. Shortly after he turned twelve he passed away. His fight against AIDS was like a light of hope for millions of AIDS sufferers.

*NOTE: The story is related to the theme; Leef gesond (Live healthy) because it's about an AIDS sufferer who does not lose hope. As a child he did so much to make people aware of the disease and to give AIDS sufferers the hope they need in order to survive.
