TENSES — PAST, L PRESENT, FUTURE

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DEFINITION: the word **tense** indicates the **time** of an **action** or an **event**.



Present Tense

We use the **present tense** for something that happens **every day** or **usually**.

Present tense – means today

Simple sentence:

Subject + verb + object

Example: I walk to school.

He walks to school.

Past Tense

We use the **past tense** for something that **has happened**.

Past tense – means yesterday

Simple sentence:

Subject + verb (in past tense) + object

Example: I walked to school.

He walked to school.

Future Tense

We use the **future tense** for something we plan to do in the future, or we predict that it will happen.

Future tense – means tomorrow

Simple sentence:

Subject + will/shall +verb + object

Example: I shall walk to school.



He will walk to school.

DATE:

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Tenses - Past, Present, Future

DEFINITION: the word **tense** indicates the **time** of an **action** or an **event**.

Future Tense:

We use the **future tense** for something we plan to do in the future or we predict that it will happen.

Future tense - means tomorrow

Simple sentence: Subject + will/shall +verb + object

Example: I shall walk to school. He will walk to school.
