When did you laugh?

Yesterday.

ATE

I ate lunch today.

When did you eat lunch?

Today.

SANG

I sang immediately.

When did you sing?

Immediately.

Adverbs of frequency

LAUGHED

I often laughed with my friend.

How often did you laugh with your friend?

Often.

ATE

I once ate a Mopani worm.

How often did you eat a Mopani worm?

Once.

SANG

I occasionally sang in the choir.

How often did you sing in the choir?

Occasionally.

Adverbs of place

LAUGHED

I laughed everywhere I went.

Where did you laugh?

Everywhere.

ATE

I ate downstairs.

Where did you eat?

Downstairs.

SANG

I sang here.

Where did you sing?

Here.

Adverbs of degree

LAUGHED

I laughed **too** loudly.

ATE

I ate **rather** slowly.

SANG

I sang **really** tunefully.
