<u>Date</u> <u>The continuous (progressive) tense</u> Page 86 – 87

Dad was making tea. Michael was doing a navigation lesson. The verbs above are in continuous or progressive tense. This tense is used for actions that continue or are ongoing for a while.

The continuous tense can be used in the *present, past* and *future*.

This tense can be used in different ways:

- For an action that began in the past and is still continuing, for example: I am reading a fantastic novel.
- For an action going on when another action took place, for example: I was reading when she arrived.
 While I was reading, she arrived.
- For an action going on at a particular time, for example: At 9 o'clock I was reading.
 - For an action in the future, for example: Tomorrow morning I shall be going to see the doctor.
