1. Oral counting: 0 to 30 and backwards from 30 to 0

Count out objects to 20 using counters, beans, pebbles or whatever you have available.

Count out 7

Count out 8

Count out 11

Count out 15

Count out 20

Count out 16

Check that you have counted correctly.

2. Put these numbers in order from the smallest to the biggest. You may use your number chart to help you.

12 4 7 19

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6 20 11 16

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3 17 10 20

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Now put the numbers in order from biggest to smallest:

6 15 11 4

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3 10 8 18

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13 7 6 5


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3. Story sums

Do a drawing to show how you worked out the sum, then write the correct answer. These are the story sums we always do on your yellow boards at school. Remember to just draw circles, not proper pictures. Here is an example to remind you how to do them.

Mary has two books in her bookcase. Her mom buys her another three for Christmas. How many books does she have now? Write the answer in the block.

Draw the circles for each part of the sum. It is a plus sum, so count the circles and write the answer in the block.

1. Bogosi is having a birthday party. His friends give him six birthday presents. Later his granny comes to visit and brings him three more. How many presents did he get for his birthday?

2. Anni has four red flowers and six yellow ones. How many flowers did she pick altogether?

3. There are five little rabbits playing on the grass. Three more come to join them. How many rabbits are there on the grass now?

4. Write your numbers and number names from one to ten. You should be able to do this without looking, but if you need help the number names are on page 20 of your red homework folder, just after the 100 chart.
