I. Oral counting: 0 to 40 and 40 to 0


Counting objects:

• Draw 8 circles


• Draw 12 squares

## 4. Story sums:


These are minus sums so you must take away.

Draw your three birds. One flies away, so cross off one. Count how many circles are left and write the answer in the block.



Now try these in the same way:

Amogelang catches 5 fish. Well done Amo!
 His family eats 3 of them for supper.
 How many are left?
