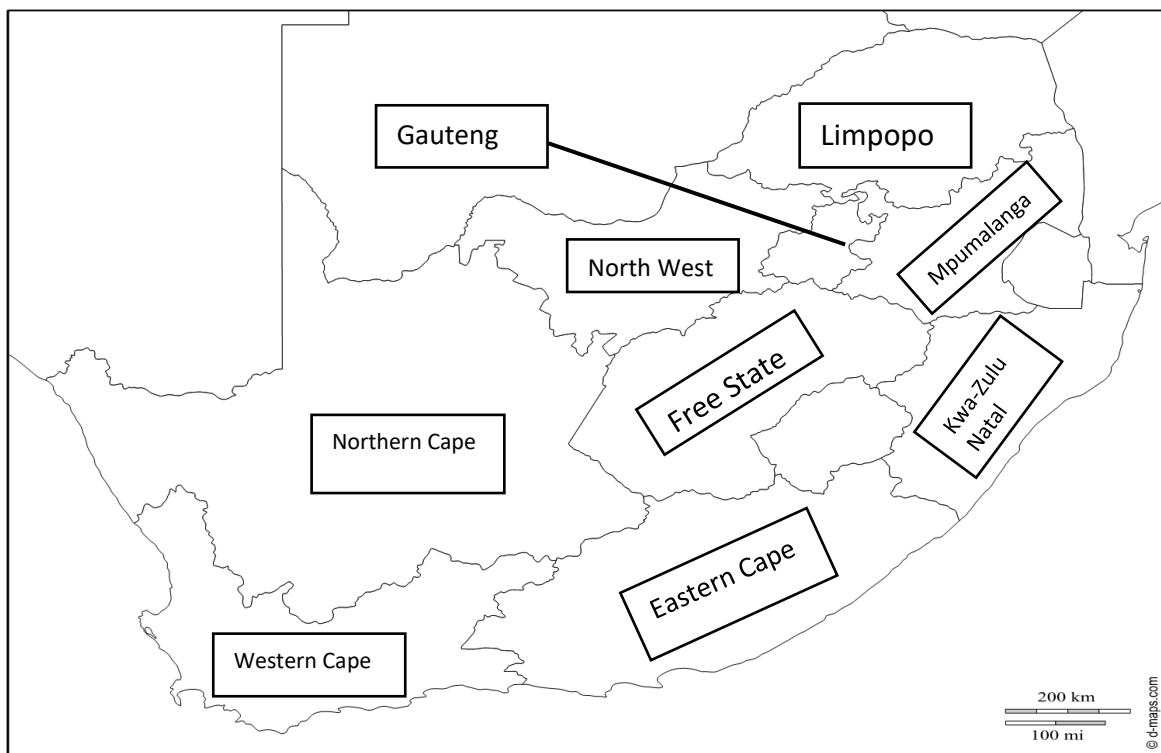

A Weather Report:

The following was the national weather report for South Africa at 18:00, Thursday 12th August 2012.

- The Northern Cape has dry, sunny conditions with no wind and high temperatures.
- The Western Cape has heavy rainfall and storms over the Cape Peninsula.
- The Free State has dry conditions with cool temperatures.
- The Eastern Cape has strong winds and is overcast but it is not raining.
- Kwa-Zulu Natal has cloudy conditions but little wind, and no rain.
- Limpopo and Mpumalanga have thunderstorms with high temperatures.
- Gauteng has clear, calm, windless conditions.



Questions:

1. Which provinces are experiencing no rain?
2. What is the difference between the weather in the Northern Cape and in the Western Cape?
3. What kind of weather is Pretoria experiencing?
4. People who are going to work in Cape Town need to be careful when they drive on the roads. Why?
5. What kind of clothing would you decide to wear if you lived in East London? Why?
6. Is a “gale force wind” a strong or light wind?
7. Does a “risk of lightening strikes” mean there will be lightening or there might be lightening?
8. Does “heavy rain” mean the drops are very heavy or there is a lot of rain expected?
9. Why do we need to know the weather for the day?
