1) Design a poster (A4 size) to educate children in your school on what their rights are;

- \* Your poster should be neat and colourful.
- \* You should clearly state at least <u>3 children's rights</u>.
- \* You should say <u>where</u> a child can go if their rights are violated.
  - Your poster should have at least <u>3 children's rights</u>. Look at the list below:
    - Children have the right to a safe environment.
    - Children have the right to a good education.
    - Children have the right to proper medical care.
    - Children have the right to clean drinking water.
    - Children have the right to healthy food.
    - Children have the right to be protected from conflict, cruelty, exploitation and neglect.
    - Children have the right to be protected from abuse.
    - Children have the right to be cared for in a loving home where they are respected.
    - Children have the right to be heard.
    - Children have the right to be treated fairly.
    - Children have the right to play and participate in sport.
    - Children have the right to freedom of religion and thought.
  - On your poster you should've also said <u>where a child can go</u> for help if their rights are being violated.
