- Your poster should have at least 3 children's rights. Look at the list below:


- Children have the right to a safe environment.

- Children have the right to clean drinking water.
- Children have the right to healthy food.
- Children have the right to be protected from conflict, cruelty, exploitation and neglect.
- Children have the right to be protected from abuse.
- Children have the right to be cared for in a loving home where they are respected.
- Children have the right to be heard.
- Children have the right to be treated fairly.
- Children have the right to play and participate in sport.
- Children have the right to freedom of religion and thought.

- On your poster you should've also said where a child can go for help if their rights are being violated.
