What is an idiom?

- An idiom is a commonly accepted way of saying things. It is a combination of words that has a meaning that is <u>different from the meanings of the individual words</u> themselves.
- An idiom can have a literal meaning in one situation and a different idiomatic meaning in another situation.

For example:

"To sit on the fence"

To sit on the fence has a literal meaning. — You are sitting on a fence.
 Figurative or idiomatic meaning — A person who is not making a clear choice. We say, the politician sat on the fence and would not give his opinion about the tax issue.
