Well, one reason is that ninjas were very secretive and left behind few historical records of their activities. Since we do not know much about what they actually did, we are left to speculate. Another reason why people often think that ninjas had superhuman abilities is because of how ninjas are depicted in folklore (particularly during the Edo period in Japan). In such legends and works of art, ninjas were mysticized and romanticized. These romantic notions of ninjas as superhero are perpetuated in media today, but maybe that's just because these days people expect ninjas to have supernatural abilities. Ki-yah!

- Does not cover the main idea clearly.
- Uses too much text from the passage.
- Only read the first sentence.
- Did not read the text.

Example response 5

This text is about why people think ninjas have super powers because they were secretive and legends.

- + Covers the main idea.
- + Covers all key ideas.
- + Is in the author's own words.
- + Is very nicely summarized.
- + Does not include opinions or background information.

Suggested answers

- 1. Example Title: Circus Trains: Changing the Way they Operated.
- 2. **Example Summary:** Circuses used to have a difficult time travelling and had to stop at many small towns along the way. Trains allowed circuses to travel easily from big city to big city.
- 3. **Example Title:** TGV: A Record Setting Train.
- 4. **Example Summary:** The TGV is a French train that set a record for the fastest wheeled train and the fastest passenger train service.
- 5. **Example Title:** *The Train: Mother of the Cowboy.*
- 6. **Example Summary:** Cows were not worth a lot of money until they could be easily transported to the East after the invention of the train. Many people then became cowboys despite the dangers that they faced.
- 7. Example Title: Death of the Electric Tram.
- 8. **Example Summary:** This passage is about how many large companies that served the automotive market conspired to dismantle the electric trolley car system and replace them with less desirable buses.

Suggested answers

- 1. Example Title: The Mysterious Origin of the Word Ninja.
- 2. **Example Summary:** The word *ninja* has mysterious origins, but it probably derived from the word *shinobi-no-mono*, which looks nothing like *ninja* in English but is very similar in kanji.
- 3. **Example Title:** *The Scabbard: More Than Just a Sheath.*
- 4. **Example Summary:** The katana was a powerful fighting sword, but the scabbard had additional uses as a climbing tool, a probing tool and a blinding weapon.
- 5. Example Title: The Myth of the Ninja.
- 6. **Example Summary:** People think that ninjas had superpowers because ninjas have been portrayed like that in art and media. With few historical records to correct these misconceptions, the myths prevail.
- 7. **Example Title:** *Disguised is the New Black: How Ninjas Really Dressed.*
- 8. **Example Summary:** Ninjas probably did not actually wear black suits as they are popularly depicted. It is likely that they wore more advantageous disguises such as farmer, fortune-teller, merchant or monk.

- 10. Books were very expensive to produce until Gutenberg's invention made them more affordable. Any appropriate quotes to support your answer.

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Suggested answers

- *1.* For example, to introduce:
 - a list: We bought the following items of stationery: pens, pencils and erasers.
 - an explanation: *He decided not to wear a jersey: it was a very hot day.* (2)
- 2. The parts of speech are a verb and a noun: \mathbf{n} =noun; \mathbf{v} =verb. *announce* = noun; *announcing* = verb. (6)
- Definition 2, make known the arrival or imminence of, is the correct definition in the context of the passage. (2)
- 4. Any sentences which clearly show the differences in meaning among the three definitions, for example:
 I will not announce who the prefects are.
 I now announce the winners of the competition. (2)
- 5. The origin of the word "announce" is the Latin word *nuntius,* which means *messenger.* (3)
