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- 1. Along the Ring of Fire
 - 1.1. Plate boundaries, specifically subduction zones, are found around the Pacific Ocean rim.
 - 1.2. When tectonic plates grind past each other and snap, the one crustal plate can subside or rise above the other.
- 2. Yes. Haiti is located along the Caribbean plate boundary
 - 2.1. Transform

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Case Study- Earthquake in Haiti 2010

- 1. Haiti is a poor developing country. Less than half of all children attend school. Haiti needs loans
- 2. Effects of the earthquake:
 - 2.1 People lost family members and friends- 230 000 in total. Many were left unemployed and homeless- at least 3 million
 - 2.2. Women lost their livelihoods
 - 2.3. Children live in squalor and have little hope of a good education; many are orphans
 - 2.4 The damage to transport, electrical networks, and buildings was serious near total collapse
 - 2.5. 30 000 commercial buildings collapsed people were left unemployed. Repairs and loss of jobs will hit the economy hard.
- 3. Relief (help)
 - 3.1. Tabulated assistance

- 3.2. People trapped under collapsed buildings. Infrastructural damage was extensive. Damage to necessary facilities (hospitals) hampered efforts. The breakout of looting and violence delayed aid distribution
- 3.3. Food and water were in short supply, places of work and homes destroyed. Infrastructure collapsed; the country does not have money to recover.
- 4. How impacts could have been reduced;
 - 4.1. Focus on improved construction standards, providing incentives for well-planned infrastructure and preferred locations; and applied punishment measures for poor construction methods/standards.
 - 4.2. Execute a proper disaster management plan
- 5. Newspaper report to be factual yet highlight the plight of the Hattian people
