








Look at the following table. Which group is less than?

Today we are looking at things that are more than. Which of the following groups show things that are more than?

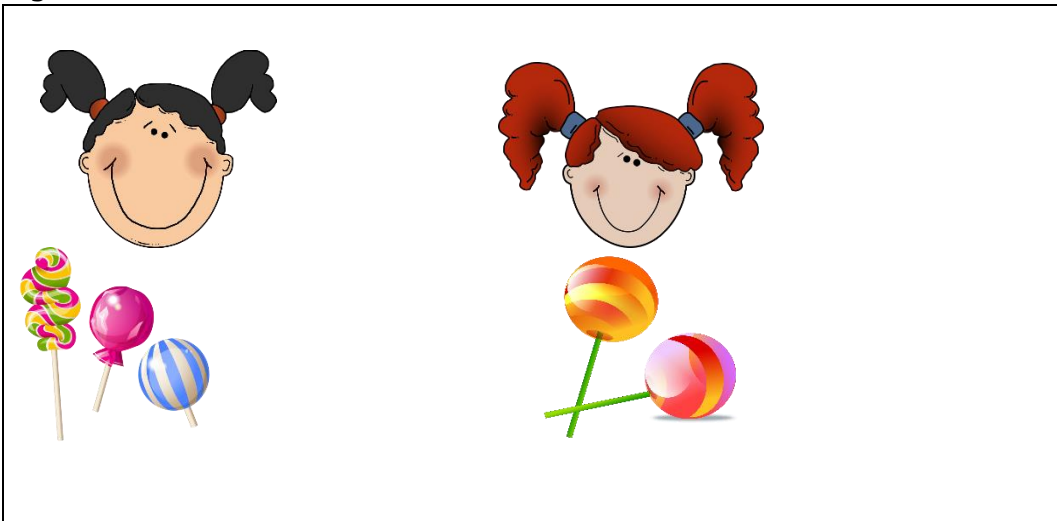
