


<u>My Family</u>

Let us look at the number 3




Now look around you and see if you can find things in groups of 3. Here are some examples:



<u>Day 2</u>


Look at the following table. Which groups are equal to each other?

<u>Day 3</u>


Look at the following table. Which group is less than?



Now take your pile of toys and make 2 piles. Make one pile less than the other.


<u>Day 4</u>

Today we are looking at things that are more than. Which of the following groups show things that are more?




<u>Day 5</u>
